Karnataka High Court Chief Justice Vibhu Bakru conducted the oath ceremony for Justice Tara Vitasta Ganju, who was sworn in as a judge.



On Tuesday, **Justice Tara Vitasta Ganju** took the oath of office as a judge of the Karnataka High Court.

Chief Justice Vibhu Bakhru of the Karnataka High Court administered the oath.

In August of this year, the Supreme Court Collegium recommended that Justice Ganju be transferred from the Delhi High Court. On October 14, the Central government announced the

move.

Several members of the Bar had strongly opposed Justice Ganju's transfer. In a letter to Chief Justice of India (CJI) BR Gavai, the DHCBA, DHCBA women attorneys, and a number of other Bar members expressed their disapproval of Justice Ganju's removal.

Justice Ganju was born in 1971 and graduated from the University of Delhi's Faculty of Law in 1995 with a Bachelor of Laws. Later, in 1999, she was awarded the British Chevening fellowship to further her legal studies in the United Kingdom.

She has been practicing law since 1995, mostly in front of the High Court. Under the original, appellate, and writ jurisdictions of the courts in Delhi and its surrounding jurisdictions, she provided legal advice and handled cases in a variety of legal fields, such as property, inheritance law, civil laws, arbitration, companies, criminal, and intellectual property disputes.

On May 18, 2022, she was appointed to the Delhi High Court as a judge.

Justice Ganju broke down in tears as she saw her daughter cry during her parting address during Monday's tearful departure ceremony at the Delhi High Court.

Justice Ganju noticed her daughter crying as she thanked her mother and daughter for their support during her career. She reassured her daughter halfway through her speech with a grin and stated
